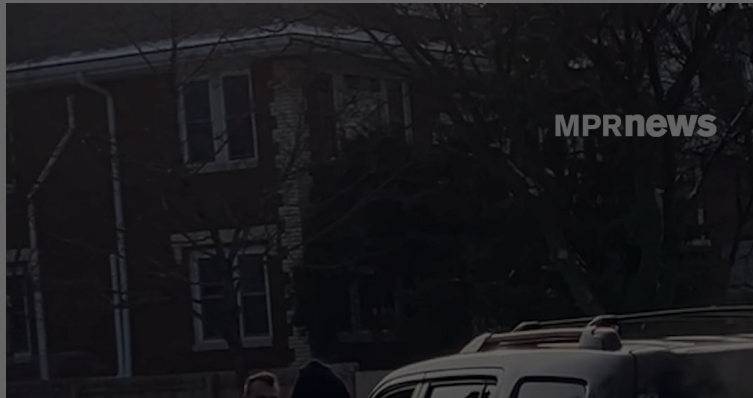

Minneapolis Public Schools leaders are canceling classes Thursday and Friday "due to safety concerns" following the killing of a woman Wednesday by an ICE agent. The district said it was acting "out of an abundance of caution."

"All MPS-sponsored programs, activities, athletics and Community Education classes, including adult education, will be canceled. The district will not move to e-learning because that is only allowable for severe weather," the district said in a

Homeland Security Secretary Kristi Noem told reporters late Wednesday that an ICE agent who shot and killed a driver in south Minneapolis was defending himself and other officers who feared they would be run down.

Noem said the woman, later identified as 37-year-old Renee Good, was among a "mob of agitators" that were harassing and impeding agents during the day in Minneapolis.

State and local officials, including Minneapolis Mayor Jacob Frey and Gov. Tim Walz, pushed back forcefully on the federal narrative that officers were justified in using deadly force.

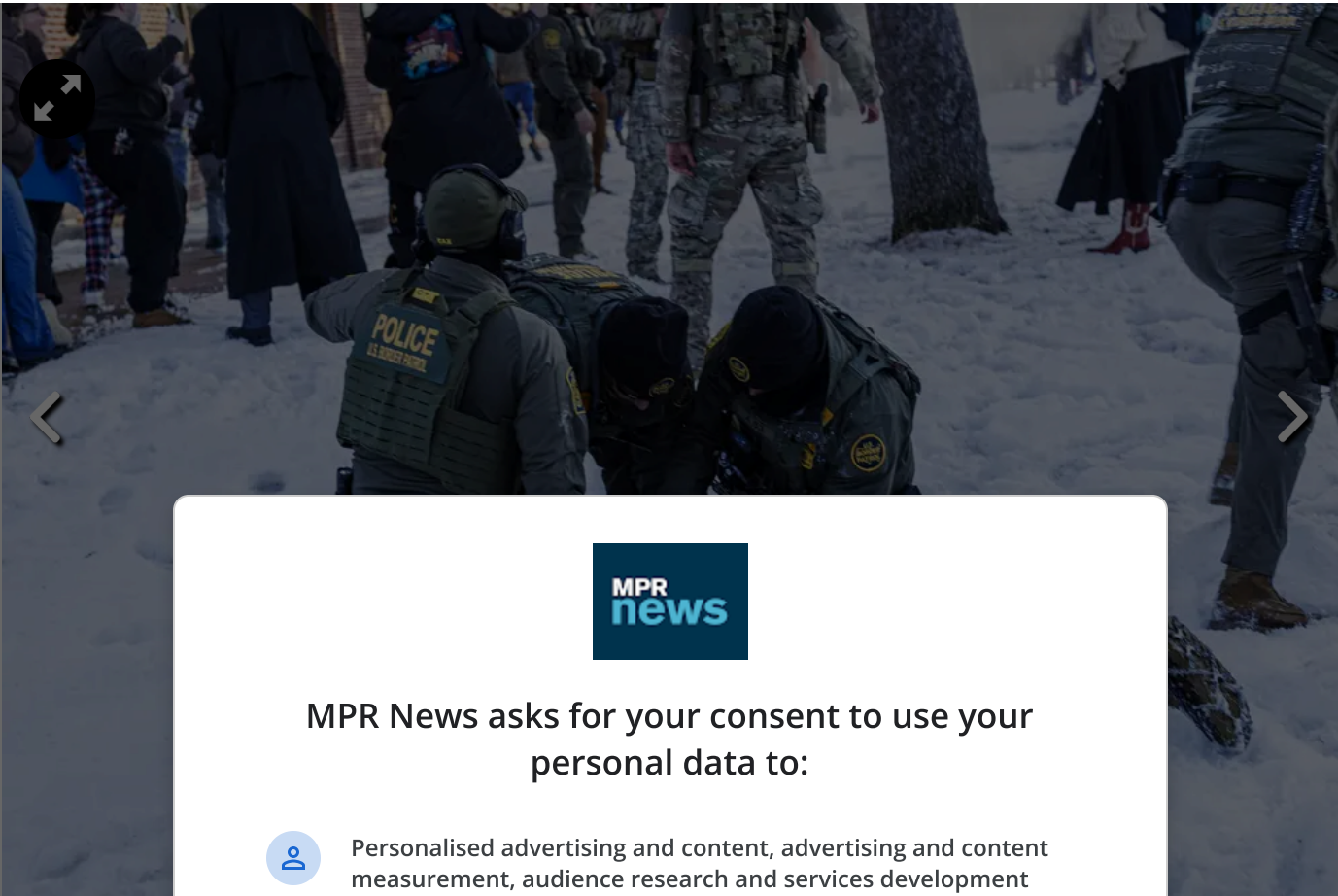

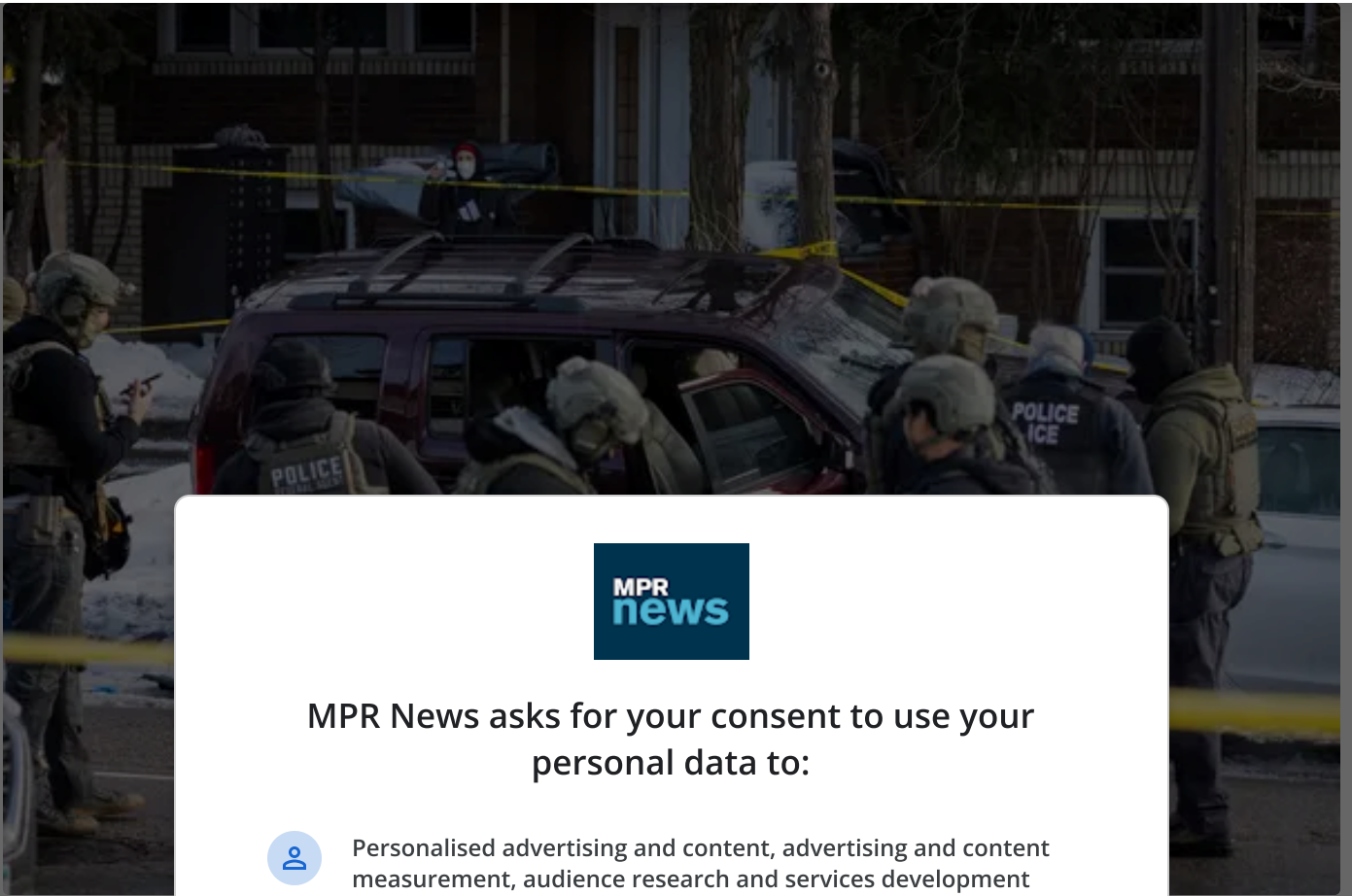

“She turned her steering wheel toward the right. 3 p.m | Walz issues 'heads-up' order to prep Minnesota National Guard, asks for protests to be peaceful

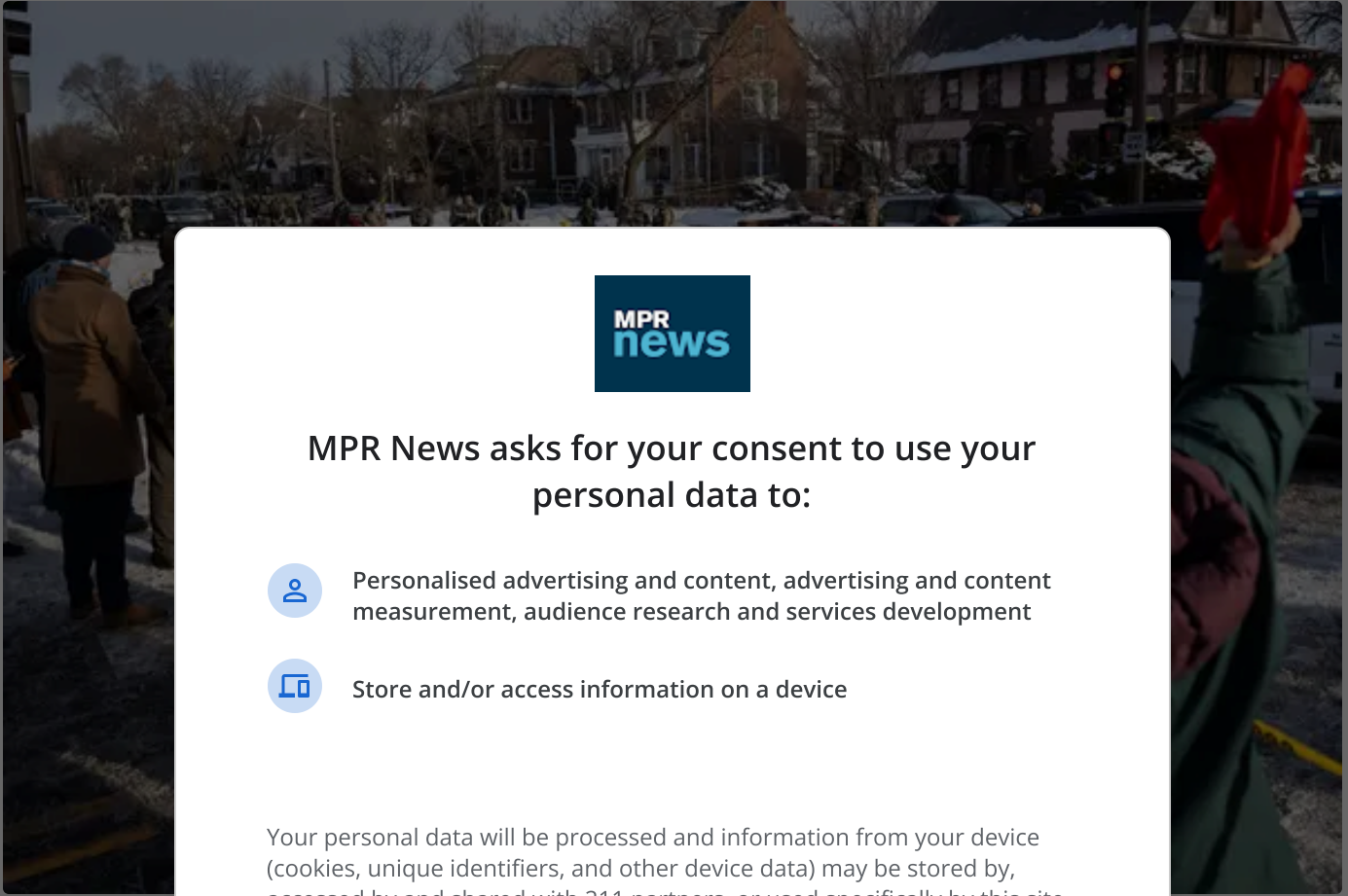

Walz told reporters that he and others had been warning that the heightened ICE operations in the Twin Cities were dangerous and likely to lead to “Tomb Raider”

He also pleaded for people to protest peacefully and not force a confrontation. "They want a show," he said of the Trump administration. "We can't give it to them."

Frey said he'd seen video of the confrontation and said ICE was "already trying to spin this as an act of self-defense. That is bullshit. This was an agent recklessly using power ... that resulted in someone dying, getting killed."

"The narrative that this was done in self-defense is a garbage narrative."

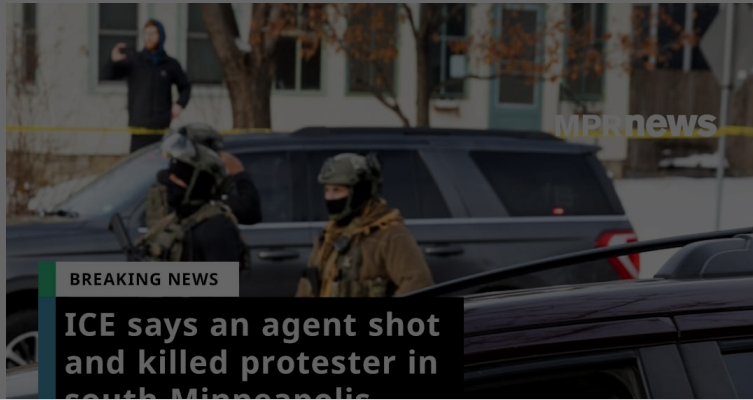

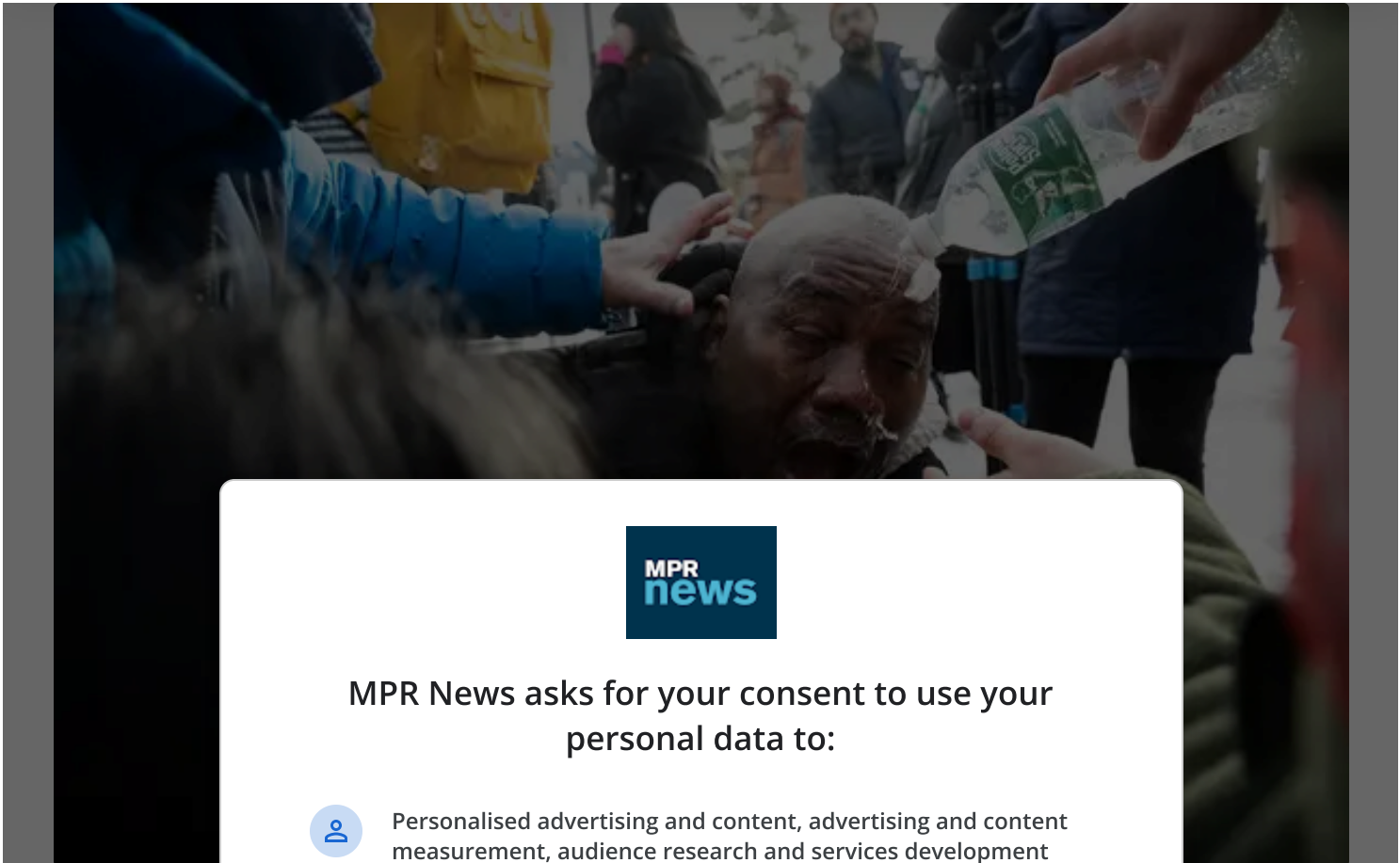

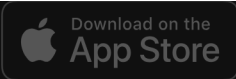
